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### Scenario

N C Happy Community Hospital 400 beds all services except NICU and Level I trauma

20 person radiology group with complete radiology services including separate IR division. 75% subspecialists. 25% generalists

Staff 1 hospital owned imaging center and 1 group owned center Full-service breast imaging and intervention with fellowship trained breast rads

No neuro intervention or Pediatric Radiologist Night reading service of all imaging...preliminary reports only



## Strengths/Weaknesses

- Established and respected in the community
- Strong breast imaging presence
- Dedicated IR services
- No neuro-intervention
- Preliminary night reads



## **Threats: Direct Competition**

Outpatient imaging centers everywhere





Acquisition/management contracts with 11 NC hospitals since 2000 Largest: Rex Hospital 559 beds 14 imaging centers in the Raleigh metro area Several 100 or more bed hospitals Many with independent private radiology practices



# What happened to the radiology groups?

 Smaller hospitals were largely staffed by larger groups and remained as previously staffed

 Independent private practice groups stayed in place at the larger hospitals.....SO FAR!!!

 Exception: one group lost a contract, and UNC placed that hospital under a flagship hospital with shared staffing

## Wayne RADIOLOGISTS, P.A.

6 fellowship trained radiologists
MRI joint venture with Wayne Memorial
Private Outpatient center
UNC acquired contract 2015

#### **Positives**

- No internal meddling in workflow
- Existing private center and jt venture remained
- No attempt to replace radiologists

#### **Negatives**

- Local and UNC incentives not aligned
- IT/PACS changes
- Hospital board replaced

#### Future worries:

after hours coverage? lack of complete subspecialty services? joint venture?

### Duke Raleigh

Legacy radiology group was absorbed into the Duke faculty as the Community Division

### **Duke Regional Hospital**

Legacy radiology group remains independent







Biggest challenge for Radiology: How to structure a joint radiology practice combining a private practice group and employed faculty group. Compounded by the radiology group partially owned by private equity

Hospital System: Premier Health (Southwest Ohio)

- 3 different radiology practices
- directive to groups: 1 contract
- two agreed to merge, third did not
- Current Group: Radiology Physicians, Inc. (RPI)
