

## **Hedvig Hricak, MD, PhD, FACR**

**Dr. Hedvig Hricak** is Chair of the Department of Radiology, Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center (MSK), a member of the Molecular Pharmacology and Chemistry Program, Sloan Kettering Institute, and Professor, Gerstner Sloan Kettering Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences, New York, NY. The hallmark of her research career has been the clinical translation and validation of new diagnostic imaging technologies, primarily for oncologic applications. She is particularly renowned for pioneering the application of MRI to prostate and gynecological cancers. Her publication record includes more than 410 peer-reviewed original research articles and over 135 monographs and book chapters. She is a member of the National Academy of Medicine and has been president of a number of prominent professional organizations, including the Radiological Society of North America and the Society for the Advancement of Women's Imaging. She has also served on the Nuclear and Radiation Studies Board of the U.S. National Academy of Sciences, the National Institutes of Health Board of Scientific Counselors, and on many other national and international advisory bodies. She has long been committed to promoting education and international collaboration in imaging and to mentoring the next generation of imaging leaders—both male and female. Working with non-profit agencies in the United States and abroad and with faculty and staff from MSK, she initiated successful efforts to provide education and equipment necessary for breast cancer screening programs in Croatia and Serbia, and since 2004, she has led a fellowship program, funded by a grant from the Breast Cancer Research Foundation, which has trained over 35 breast imaging radiologists from 16 countries, with the goal of improving breast cancer patient outcomes worldwide. She also co-leads an NIH-funded partnership between MSK and The City College of New York aimed at increasing the number of underrepresented minority and low-income students who enroll in and complete MD, PhD or MD/PhD programs. Dr. Hricak's numerous honors and awards include foreign membership in the Croatian Academy of Arts and Sciences and the Russian Academy of Science and honorary doctorates from the Ludwig Maximilian University, Munich, Germany and University of Toulouse III, Paul Sabatier in Toulouse, France.
