

**Yoshimi Anzai, M.D., MPH, FACR**

Dr. Yoshimi Anzai is a Professor of Radiology at the University of Utah, an Adjunct Professor of Population Health Sciences and Neurosurgery, and the Director of Value and Safety at Enterprise Imaging and oversees the quality and safety of radiology and imaging services.

Dr. Anzai graduated from Chiba University in Japan, completed a radiology residency and neuroradiology fellowship at the University of Michigan, and obtained a Master of Public Health at the University of Washington. Dr. Anzai has 25 years of experience in neuroradiology and served as the president of the ASHNR, AUR, and AAWR. In addition, she has served as co-director of the Comparative Effectiveness Research Training (CERT) program to foster health services research within radiology disciplines. Currently, she serves as the chair of the RSNA R& E Foundation Grant study section and Deputy Editor for Radiology.

Her primary clinical and research focus has been head and neck cancer, neurodegenerative disease, and traumatic brain injury. Dr. Anzai has received grant funding from AHRQ, CTSA, and industry partners and has over 170 peer-reviewed publications and 37 review articles. She received the AAWR Marie Sklodowska-Curie Award in 2019, RSNA Gold Medal in 2021, and ASHNR Gold Medal in 2022. Despite her administrative responsibilities and societal contribution, she enjoys clinical days working with residents, fellows, and students.

Dr. Anzai strongly advocates for gender equity and inclusivity and believes in mentorship and allyship that embrace diversity in medicine. Dr. Anzai is also the co-director of Women in Health, Medicine, and Sciences. Under her leadership, the WiHMS collaborated broadly with talented researchers on the University of Utah main campus to establish the Gender-based Violence Consortium (GBVC). GBVC involves youth education for prevention, early detection of domestic violence victims through the emergent medical responders and trauma care, community outreach, and recovery support.
